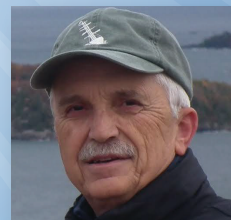

The U.S. tried to remain neutral during the Great War, but the May 1915 torpedoing of the Cunard liner Lusitania—which sank in 18 minutes, killing many, including 128 Americans—changed the course. This episode examines how that tragedy set the U.S. on a collision path with Germany leading to World War I entry, with historian David Kaplan exploring the roles of President Woodrow Wilson, First Lord of the Admiralty Winston Churchill, and U-boat Captain Walther Schwieger.
